PARKING There are more than 40 parking lots and garages plus metered street parking (read signs carefully for parking hours) in Center City. To pay for metered parking, you can use a variety of payment methods (including credit cards) at one of the green kiosks. Some parking zones are supported by the ParkMobile app (available for Android and iOS), which allows you to pay for and extend your parking time via your mobile device. 



IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS

CONVENTION CENTER DISTRICT/CHINATOWN

Anchored by the Pennsylvania Convention Center, this bustling district offers great shopping, dining and cultural institutions, and is the entry point to the **Rail Park**, a former railroad viaduct converted into a scenic, elevated trail.

SEE & DO: Admire the **Friendship Gate**, a gift from Philadelphia's sister city of Tianjin, which welcomes visitors to Philadelphia's Chinatown (chinatown-pcdc.org) – the second largest Chinatown on the East Coast. Tour the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (pafa.org), the oldest art museum and art school in the nation. Stroll through Dilworth Park (dilworthpark.com), home to seasonal experiences year-round, including a roller rink in the spring and ice rink, holiday market and cozy cabin in the winter. Take an interior or exterior tour of the iconic City Hall (phlvisitorcenter.com/ CityHallInteriorExterior), home to over 250 sculptures by Alexander Milne Calder, including the largest statue atop any building in the world. Shop tax-free clothes and shoes at one of the city's marquee shopping destinations, including Macy's (macys.com) and the sprawling Fashion District Philadelphia (fashiondistrictphiladelphia. com), spanning three city blocks and home to a mix of shopping, dining, entertainment and cultural experiences.

Reading Terminal Market (readingterminalmarket.org), home to over 80 independent vendors under one roof. In Chinatown, enjoy authentic Chinese dishes at Sang Kee Peking Duck House (sangkeechinatown.com) At the base of the Canopy by Hilton hotel, enjoy fresh seafood and cocktails at The Wayward (thewayward.com) American brasserie. For elevated American dining (think dryaged cowboy steak and potatoes), plus a selection of house barrelaged spirits, Bank & Bourbon (bankandbourbon.com) at the base of the Loews Philadelphia Hotel is unmatched.



FRIENDSHIP GATE

OLD CITY/SOCIETY HILL/WATERFRONT

Discover America's spirit in the city where it all began at **Independence National Historical Park** with iconic sites like the **Liberty Bell** and **Independence Hall**. Then, stroll along quaint cobblestone streets such as **Elfreth's Alley** or explore trendy boutiques and art galleries.

SEE & DO: Check out the many museums in the neighborhood, including the African American Museum in Philadelphia (aampmuseum.org), which presents impactful exhibits like Audacious Freedom: African Americans in Philadelphia, 1776-1876. At the Weitzman National Museum of American Jewish History (nmajh. org), discover the 360-year history of Jewish People in the U.S. Stroll the Delaware River Waterfront (delawareriverwaterfront.com) to find former industrial piers transformed into public spaces, such as the recreational Race Street Pier and the multipurpose Cherry Street Pier (cherrystreetpier.com), home to artist studios, pop-up markets, and a riverside dining space. Explore America's maritime history at the Independence Seaport Museum (phillyseaport.org) and climb aboard two historic ships docked nearby. Don't miss seasonal waterfront experiences including summer and winter pop-ups at Blue Cross RiverRink (riverrink.com) and the dreamy summertime oasis at Spruce Street Harbor Park (sprucestreetharborpark.com).


DINE: Visit The Bourse (theboursephilly.com) to discover a modern food hall inside of a historic landmark building featuring a mix of global cuisine, including Philadelphia-centric options. Walk along 2nd Street in Old City for more international flavors, including Cuban fare served in an open-air vibe modeled after a Havana streetscape at Cuba Libre (cubalibrerestaurant.com/en/philadelphia), or Southern Italian dishes presented on an open-air patio at Positano Coast (positanocoast. net). At Zahav (zahavrestaurant.com) – James Beard Award-winner for Outstanding Restaurant in 2019 – enjoy an Israeli menu of small plates, grilled vegetables and meat, and freshly whipped humus served with warm, housemade pitas. For dessert, order scoops of house made ice cream from a turn-of-the-century ice cream parlor setting at Franklin Fountain (franklinfountain.com).

PARKWAY MUSEUMS DISTRICT/FAIRMOUNT

Centered around the magnificent Museum Mile on the Benjamin Franklin Parkway – modeled after the Champs Élysées in France – this district offers outstanding museums and plenty of Insta-worthy sights.

SEE & DO: One of the world's finest collections of impressionist, post-impressionist, and early modernist paintings awaits inside the **Barnes Foundation (barnesfoundation.org)**. Head next door to the museum dedicated to the art of French sculptor Auguste Rodin. The **Rodin Museum (rodinmuseum.org)** houses one of the largest collections of the artist's sculptures outside of Paris. "The Thinker" sits in front of the museum contemplating two of the many masterpieces within the intimate museum's gates, "The Burghers of Calais" and "The Gates of Hell." Enjoy an unconventional history lesson as you navigate the crumbling cellblocks of **Eastern State Penitentiary (easternstate.org)**, once the most expensive and famous prison in the world.

DINE: For a literal elevated dining experience, head to the top of the Comcast Technology Center to find Jean-Georges Philadelphia (jean-georges.com) and accompanying lounge, JG SkyHigh (jgskyhigh.com). Occupying the 59th and 60th floors of the luxurious Four Seasons Hotel Philadelphia at Comcast Center, these chic dining destinations feature food from Michelin-starred chef Jean-Georges Vongerichten and unbeatable views of the surrounding cityscape through floor-to-ceiling windows. On the ground floor, Vernick Fish (vernickphilly.com) delivers refined seafood dishes. Nearby, find reservation-free pubs, taquerias, pizza parlors, and steakhouses, including Pizzeria Vetri (pizzeriavetri.com) and Iron Chef Jose Garces' Buena Onda Tacos (buenaondatacos.com).





RITTENHOUSE SQUARE

Located in the heart of Center City, Rittenhouse Square is known for its green spaces, upscale shopping, arts and culture, and alfresco dining.

SEE & DO: Walk through the neighborhood's namesake park, filled with sculptures and plenty of picnic-perfect benches and lawns. Indulge in retail therapy at the chic boutiques, national retailers and luxury brands located along Chestnut and Walnut streets. Take in a live performance by Opera Philadelphia (operaphila.org), The Philadelphia Orchestra (philorch. org) and other top performing arts companies at the venues lining the Avenue of the Arts (avenueofthearts.org), including the Kimmel Center Cultural Campus (kimmelculturalcampus.org) and associated venues Academy of Music (academyofmusic.org) and Merriam Theater (kimmelculturalcampus.org/plan-your-visit/venues/merriam-theater).


sandwich at **K'Far** (**kfarcafe.com**), or with freshly fried cake donuts topped with sugar at **Federal Donuts** (**federaldonuts.com**). Enjoy a Parisian brasserie experience in the heart of Philadelphia at **Parc** (**parc-restaurant.com**), complete with alfresco seating along Rittenhouse Square. **a.kitchen** and **a.bar** (**akitchenandbar.com**) occupy the first floor of the AKA Rittenhouse Square hotel and feature a menu of seasonal American bistro dishes complemented by an innovative wine and spirits program. For Mexican-inspired cuisine, seek out **Condesa** (**condesaphilly.com**) on the ground floor of the Motto by Hilton hotel, or take the elevator to the top floor for **El Techo**, a rooftop taqueria featuring tacos, margaritas and more beneath a retractable glass roof that offers impressive views of the surrounding city.

WASHINGTON SQUARE WEST/GAYBORHOOD/MIDTOWN VILLAGE

Lively dining spots and vibrant nightlife fill this quaint historic neighborhood. Stroll through tree-lined Washington Square Park or explore the charming Belgian block streets for some of Philadelphia's most photogenic views.

SEE & DO: Explore Philadelphia's medical history at **Pennsylvania Hospital** (**pennmedicine.org**). The nation's first hospital is also home to the nation's first surgical ampitheatre and medical library – both of which can be viewed during a tour of the historic Pine Building. In the evening, take in a show at the **Walnut Street Theatre (walnutstreettheatre.org)**, America's oldest theater. Explore Philadelphia's "Mural Mile" on a walking tour offered by **Mural Arts Philadelphia** (**muralarts.org/tours**) or join **Beyond the Bell Tours** (**beyondthebelltours.com**) to navigate the Gayborhood on foot as you learn about Philadelphia's LGBTQ+ history, notable community leaders, and murals that highlight their contributions.

(doubleknotphilly.com), a restaurant and café concept from the Schulson Collective. Return in the evening and head downstairs to enjoy the restaurant's underground izakaya, with a menu including robatayaki meats, sushi, dumplings, and more. Double Knot is flanked by two other Schulson eateries - Sampan (sampanphilly.com), a Pan-Asian restaurant, and Alpen Rose (alpenrosephl.com), a steakhouse with a refined, library-esque dining room. Nearby, El Vez (elvezrestaurant.com) serves contemporary Mexican dishes - including five variations of guacamole - in a trendy taqueria setting. Located in the historic Curtis Center, P.J. Clarke's (pjclarkes.com) is a hot spot thanks to its large raw bar, happy hour specials and famous burgers.

SOUTH PHILADELPHIA

Known for its easy access to major sporting arenas, this energetic neighborhood is also a hit thanks to multicultural and foodie attractions.

SEE & DO: Walk along the eclectic **South Street**, which stretches river to river, to explore an ever-changing line-up of restaurants and shops, with the exception of a few old stand-bys. Stroll **East Passyunk Avenue** (visiteastpassyunk.com) to find a seemingly endless assortment of local boutiques and shops selling a mix of apparel, jewelry, art, home goods and more. Retrace Rocky's running route as you navigate the openair stalls and multicultural storefronts of the **9th Street Italian Market** (italianmarketphilly.org). Explore the nation's oldest Swedish museum, American Swedish Museum (americanswedish.org), then take a walk through the spacious FDR Park. Take a short ride to the southeast to find one of Philadelphia's hidden gems. The **Simeone Foundation Automotive Museum** (simeonemuseum.org) is home to one of the world's greatest collections of racing sports cars, featuring a collection of over 75 historically significant cars from makers such as Ferrari, Porsche, Bugatti, Aston Martin, and more.


Philadelphia, such as Victor Café (victorcafe.com) where the servers double as opera singers that perform every 20 minutes. And yes, there are plenty of cheesesteaks to sink your teeth into, including the ever-popular Pat's King of Steaks (patskingofsteaks.com) and Geno's Steaks (genosteaks.com), alongside local favorites Jim's South Street (jimssouthstreet.com) and Angelo's Pizzeria (angelospizzeriasouthphiladelphia.com). Grab a drink at one of Philadelphia's most unique rooftop bars, Bok Bar (bok-bar.com), found atop a former high school that now functions as a mixed-use space home to artist studios and small businesses. On the opposite end of the same roof, savor modern Sicilian dishes and handmade pasta at Irwin's (irwinsupstairs.com).


UNIVERSITY CITY/WEST PHILADELPHIA

A hub for higher education, this neighborhood is home to top universities, including **Drexel University** and the **University of Pennsylvania**.

SEE & DO: Enjoy one of the best views of the Philadelphia skyline from **Cira Green** (**ciragreen.com**), a rooftop park and event space that tops a parking garage near 30th Street Station. On the **University of Pennsylvania** (**upenn.edu**) campus, explore priceless archaeological artifacts from around the globe – including the largest Sphinx in the western hemisphere – at the **Penn Museum** (**penn.museum**). Take in a theater, dance or world-music performance at **Penn Live Arts** (**pennlivearts.org**) and view installations from up-and-coming artists at the **Institute of Contemporary Art** (**icaphila.org**), which hosted Andy Warhol's first solo museum show in 1965. Explore the **Philadelphia Zoo** (**philadelphiazoo.org**) – the nation's oldest and one of the world's best.

DINE: Start at Walnut Street Café (walnutstreetcafe.com), a modern café at the base of the FMC Tower that serves up American plates breakfast through dinner. White Dog Café (whitedog.com) serves locally sourced, organic dishes in a charming Victorian brownstone adorned with dog-themed décor. At Booker's Restaurant & Bar (bookersrestaurantandbar.com), savor modern takes on traditional Southern-inspired dishes, including vegan jambalaya, blackened catfish, and an extra spicy Jamaican jerk oxtail. Don't miss Argentinian café and bakery, Jezabel's (jezabelscafe.com), owned by Jezabel Careaga, known for their assortment of empanadas and alfajores. Sip local suds at Dock Street Brewery (dockstreetbeer.com), Philadelphia's first microbrewery, where pints are poured and wood-oven pizzas are served inside of a 110-year-old firehouse.





NORTHERN LIBERTIES/FISHTOWN/NORTH PHILADELPHIA

Just north of Center City, these diverse neighborhoods are home to eclectic restaurants, landmark gastropubs, craft breweries and distilleries, and popular live-music venues.

SEE & DO: Stroll through these neighborhoods to shop from local boutiques and small businesses selling artisan goods. In Northern Liberties, **Trunc (trunc.net)** sells handcrafted goods including art, clothing, jewelry, and apothecary items. Peruse and purchase literature that celebrates female writers, activists and artists at Black-owned **Harriett's Bookshop** (**oursisterbookshops.com**) along Girard Avenue in Fishtown. Try your luck at **Rivers Casino (riverscasino.com)**, with 1,755 slot machines, 105 table games, 62 hybrid gaming seats, a 28-table poker room, and a state-of-the-art sportsbook. In the evening, visit **Fabrika (fabrikaphilly.com)**, a dinner theater that spans two floors, features three bars and hosts nightly performances including circus and cabaret acts, live music and more. Enjoy more live entertainment at **Johnny Brenda's (johnnybrendas.com)**, **The Fillmore** (**thefillmorephilly.com**), **The Met Philadelphia (themetphilly.com)**, or the newly opened **Brooklyn Bowl (brooklynbowl.com/philadelphia)**.

DINE: For breakfast or brunch, consider Café La Maude (cafelamaude.com), a French-Lebanese café that was named one of Yelp's Top 100 Places to Eat in 2021. One of the best new restaurants in the world according to Condé Nast Traveler, Kensington's Laser Wolf (laserwolfphilly.com) serves an array of Israeli skewers, fresh hummus, warm pitas, baba ganoush, and more. The area is also fast becoming a destination for the city's booming craft beer scene, with local suds available at one of several breweries, such as Yards Brewing Company (yardsbrewing.com), Love City Brewing (lovecitybrewing.com), or Triple Bottom Brewing Company (triplebottombrewing.com) – Pennsylvania's first certified B-Corporation brewery.

NORTHWEST PHILADELPHIA

The vibrant neighborhoods of Northwest Philadelphia feature wooded trails, historic sites and booming business districts with local shops, eateries and bars.

SEE & DO: Survey the 16 early American sites of **Historic Germantown** (**freedomsbackyard.com**) and tour the **Johnson House Historic Site** (**johnsonhouse.org**), once a station along the
Underground Railroad. Take advantage of tax-free shopping at the
boutiques and shops in quaint **Chestnut Hill** (**chestnuthillpa.com**) or
along Main Street in **Manayunk** (**manayunk.com**). Admire beautiful,
year-round gardens and some of the rarest trees in the city at the
92-acre **Morris Arboretum** (**morrisarboretum.org**). Visit **Woodmere Art Museum** (**woodmereartmuseum.org**) for engaging exhibits from
Philadelphia-area artists. Explore the 1,800-acre **Wissahickon Valley Park** (**fow.org**), an urban oasis of dense forests, bubbling streams, and
more than 50 miles of biking, hiking and horse-riding trails

DINE: The Market at the Fareway (marketatthefareway.com) in Chestnut Hill is a modern farmers market, home to over a dozen local vendors that offer a variety of items including fresh produce, sushi, Vietnamese cuisine, cinnamon buns, coffee, and more. At Jansen (jansenmtairy.com) in Mt. Airy, Chef David Jansen strikes a perfect balance between contemporary American dishes and classical French techniques, with seasonal dishes served in an elegant setting inside a quaint, 18th-century cottage. The area is also home to two of Philadelphia's most iconic sandwiches — "the Schmitter" from McNally's Tavern (mcnallys.com) and a classic cheesesteak from take-out only shop, Dalessandro's (dalessandros.com). Satisfy your sweet tooth with cookies, pies, pastries, and ice cream from Brendenbeck's Bakery & Ice Cream Parlor (bredenbecks.com).



ACROSS THE RIVER

A short drive across the Benjamin Franklin Bridge, New Jersey features plenty of family-friendly attractions that are perfect for a day trip. In the summer season, the **RiverLink Ferry** can take you from Penn's Landing to the Camden Waterfront.

Nearby, visit the Adventure Aquarium (adventureaquarium.com) to enter an underwater world home to over 8,500 marine animals. See more than 20 sharks swim through 550,000 gallons of water as you pass through a glass tunnel, journey to the Amazon through the interactive Piranha Falls exhibit, or spot hippos swimming in the immersive Hippo Haven. Catch a concert at the Waterfront Music Pavilion (specialevents. livenation.com/venues/waterfront-music-pavilion) with Philadelphia skyline views and book tee time at one of Ron Jaworski's Golf properties (ronjaworskigolf.com). You can save big at Gloucester Premium Outlets (premiumoutlets.com/ Gloucester), about a 30-minute drive from Center City Philadelphia with deep discounts and designer and name brands.

THE COUNTRYSIDE

Take the short trip to the Countryside of Philadelphia and you'll be rewarded with rich, rolling hills, charming towns and an abundance of attractions that are a perfect addition to any Philadelphia itinerary.

SEE & DO: In the bucolic Brandywine Valley, explore the grounds of the 1,077-acre Longwood Gardens (longwoodgardens.org), complete with ethereal indoor and outdoor gardens featuring seasonal displays. Explore the Mushroom Capital of the World, Kennett Square (historickennettsquare.com), to find a quaint downtown filled with local shops and restaurants. Learn about rotary-wing aircraft at the American Helicopter Museum (americanhelicopter.museum), located in a 20,000 square-foot hangar in West Chester.

Visit Valley Forge National Historical Park (nps.gov/vafo), site of the encampment of George Washington and the Continental Army during the winter of 1777-1778. Navigate miles of multi-use trails to find memorials, monuments, reconstructed Revolutionary-era cabins and General Washington's headquarters. Shop from a collection of luxury retailers unsurpassed in the region at one of the nation's most iconic and largest shopping malls, the King of Prussia Mall (simon.com/mall/king-of-prussia), home to more than 450 shops and restaurants. After shopping, feel the rush of skydiving thousands of feet above but only a few feet off the ground at iFLY Indoor Skydiving (iflyworld.com/king-of-prussia).


PHILADELPHIA MUSEUM OF ART FRANK GEHRY CORE PROJECT ADDITION

SPECIAL EVENT VENUES

HISTORIC

Philadelphia boasts countless historic buildings, museums and attractions that double as special event venues. Consider one of these landmark options for your next meeting, dinner or social outing.

Located across from the Pennsylvania Convention Center, the **Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts (PAFA)** is the nation's first and oldest art museum and art school and is a stunning setting for events, able to accommodate parties of 10 up to 1,000. The 1876 Historic Landmark Building, designed by Frank Furness and George Hewitt and home to the museum's permanent collection, is a fine example of Victorian Gothic architecture inside and out, with a grand staircase, richly tiled floors, Gothic arches, vaulted ceilings and gold rosette-studded walls.

Follow in the footsteps of the First Continental Congress with an event at **Carpenters' Hall**. Able to accommodate groups of up to 125 for receptions, this landmark locale was the early home to top institutions such as the First and Second Banks of the United States and The Franklin Institute. In the heart of Old City, the red brick Georgian-style building offers a traditional 18th-century feel, with brass chandeliers, ornate fireplaces, a blown-glass fan window and the original Windsor chairs from the first Continental Congress on display.

Known as the Grande Dame of Broad Street for good reason, the iconic **Bellevue Hotel** on South Broad Street sports French Renaissance architecture and a sophisticated interior make the hotel a favorite of meeting planners and attendees. Constructed in 1904 by distinguished hotelier George Boldt who ordered "the most magnificent ballroom in the world, no matter what it cost," it quickly became the top luxury accommodation in the United States. The hotel offers 30,000 square feet of lavish event space, including a recently renovated, 11,616-square-foot ballroom with two tiers, parquet flooring and wrought-iron accents. Don't miss the ballroom's ornate light fixtures, designed by Thomas Edison.



WITH A VIEW

Impress your guests by treating them to jaw-dropping views of Philadelphia's skyline, waterfront or iconic historic district as you entertain them at one of these photo-worthy settings.

Meet just steps from where the Founders did at **The Liberty View**. Located in the heart of America's most historic square mile, the venue features an outdoor terrace that wraps around the second floor of the Independence Visitor Center, presenting breathtaking, panoramic views of Independence Mall, including the National Constitution Center, Independence Hall and Liberty Bell Center. The 25,000-square-foot event space also includes a connected indoor ballroom with an open design that can be customized for any event.

Docked along the Delaware River waterfront, **Moshulu** offers amazing views of the river, Benjamin Franklin Bridge, and Philadelphia skyline. Your guests will enjoy award-winning cuisine while they mingle and network on the deck of the world's oldest and tallest square rigged sailing vessel still afloat.

Just across the Delaware River in Camden, New Jersey, the historic **Battleship New Jersey** – the most decorated battleship in U.S. naval history – can accommodate events in a variety of sizes and formats in one (or all) of its 11 event spaces. Both the Main Deck Portside and Forecastle present stunning views of the Philadelphia skyline on the other side of the river, with the latter featuring 16-inch gun turrets and the ship's superstructure as the backdrop.

Water Works, an iconic national historic landmark with Greek-Revival buildings, is known as the first municipal water works in the country. Using paddle wheels to pump water, the Fairmount Water Works opened in 1815 and eventually became the first to stop using this technology for more efficient water turbine engines. The indoor and outdoor spaces are used for events and offer unmatched views of Boathouse Row and the city's skyline. Situated at the foot of the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the picturesque architectural treasure on the Schuylkill River offers lavish spaces for guests, including a columned walkway, vintage gazebo and a tented veranda. The entire property can be rented.

OUTDOORS

Home to over 10,000 acres of urban parks, Philadelphia presents a variety of ways to connect with the outdoors without ever journeying too far from the hotels and attractions of Center City. Consider one of these event venues with open-air options to connect your guests with nature while offering them plenty of room to spread out.

From intimate gatherings, cocktail parties, or corporate meetings to large-scale events, the **Mann Center for the Performing Arts** is an ideal spot in Philadelphia. Located in Fairmount Park with 22 acres of lush green rolling hills and stunning skyline views, the unique, multi-use, indoor and outdoor space provides a versatile setting with options ranging up to a full facility buyout. Available spaces include the popular hilltop tent area, a smaller hilltop tent space, a twinkle-lit sculpture garden space, the open-air Skyline Stage with breathtaking views of Philadelphia, and the main Pavilion, the summer home of the Philadelphia Orchestra, which is perfect for concert performances, graduations, corporate outings and more. The facility is ADA-accessible with all production needs handled onsite.

Not far from the Mann Center and operated by Constellation Culinary Group, the **Fairmount Park Horticulture Center** provides lush indoor and outdoor spaces in West Fairmount Park. A spacious greenhouse rests adjacent to an outdoor lawn complete with a long, tree-lined reflecting pool, providing your attendees with a direct connection to Philadelphia's largest park.




Mingling can become magical in the center of the city. **Dilworth Park** spaces include the Lawn, Main Fountain, Middle Fountain, and Bridge areas.

For a truly appetizing offsite event, consider the historic **Reading Terminal Market**, one of Philadelphia's essential dining destinations. Located just steps from the Pennsylvania Convention Center, this historic public market dates back to 1893 and is home to over 80 independent vendors, many of whom are available to remain open and serve their mouthwatering menu items to up to 4,000 guests.





THINGS TO DO

Your guests can easily fill their free time by exploring Philadelphia's distinct, walkable neighborhoods, notable historic sites, impressive public art collection and popular museums and attractions — many of which are found just steps from downtown hotels and the Pennsylvania Convention Center.



Below are suggested attendee activities

BY-THE-BOOK

These essential experiences are ideal for first-time visitors or those looking to fill their itinerary with tried-and-true Philadelphia activities.

1-2 HOURS

Head to **LOVE Park**, where you can snap a selfie with Robert Indiana's iconic sculpture. Installed in 1976, this sculpture has since become one of the most photographed pieces of public art in Philadelphia and serves as a gateway to Philadelphia's Museum Mile. Stroll down the grand boulevard to the end and climb the 72 "Rocky Steps" at the **Philadelphia Museum of Art**, then go inside one of the largest art museums in the nation to explore new spaces and a collection that spans 2,000 years. Outside the back of the museum, admire one of Philadelphia's most iconic views, **Boathouse Row**.

HALF DAY

Grab a bite to eat at the historic **Reading Terminal Market** - one of our nation's oldest (and best) public markets. With over 80 independent vendors under one roof – including many essential Philadelphia delicacies – the market is sure to offer something to please any appetite. Book a Mural Mile Walking Tour with **Mural Arts Philadelphia**. Along the way, you'll learn about some of the more iconic works on view in the Mural Capital of the World, many of which are found on a milelong stretch of 13th Street. After the tour concludes, indulge in a bit of retail therapy at the many independent boutiques along 13th Street in Philadelphia's Gayborhood and Washington Square West.

FULL DAY

Add an extra day to your business trip and dedicate it to exploring Philadelphia's historic district. Start at Independence National Historical Park, where you can learn about the birthplace of American Democracy at Independence Hall and visit the timeless symbol of American freedom, the Liberty Bell. Keep the history lesson going with a visit to the Museum of the American Revolution, who traces America's founding through immersive galleries filled with original artifacts (including George Washington's actual War Tent). Visit the National Constitution Center, the only museum in the nation devoted to the U.S. Constitution, examining the document via special exhibits and programming just two blocks from where it was signed. Explore the groundwork of our nation's founding executive mansion at the President's House Historic Site.

Once home to Presidents George Washington and John Adams, this site tells the story of slavery and freedom in the early days of America.

Break for lunch and take a bite of a traditional Philadelphia cheesesteak at **Campo's Philly Cheesesteaks**. The family-owned eatery has been serving iconic Philadelphia eats on Market Street since 1947. Afterwards, walk through Old City to discover independent storefronts and even more historic sites, such as **Elfreth's Alley** – the oldest continuously inhabited residential street in the nation – and the **Betsy Ross House**.

Closer to sunset, head to 5th and Race streets for a stroll along the Benjamin Franklin Bridge's pedestrian walkway, where you'll be treated to one of the most impressive views of the Philadelphia skyline. For dinner, return to the historic streets of Old City to choose from an array of international cuisine from restaurants with indoor and outdoor dining.

UNEXPECTED

These activities take you off the beaten path and introduce some of Philadelphia's quirkier and lesser-known attractions, many guaranteed to deliver Instagram-worthy moments sure to wow your colleagues.

1-2 HOURS

Located just a short walk from the Pennsylvania Convention Center inside the sprawling **Fashion District Philadelphia** shopping complex, **Wonderspaces** is a futuristic art gallery comprised of nearly a dozen immersive and often interactive installations. Afterwards, take advantage of tax-free shopping on clothes and shoes as the many name brands available throughout the district.

More interesting art is nearby at the **Fabric Workshop and Museum**, a cool modern art exhibition space, whose unique artist-in-residence program has resulted in an archive of one-of-a-kind collaborations with internationally renowned artists such as Roy Lichtenstein and Kara Walker.

HALF DAY

Head to the neighborhood of Rittenhouse Square to find two of Philadelphia's most unique museums. Tucked along a quiet residential street, **The Rosenbach Museum** holds the private collection of the Rosenbach brothers, noted rare book dealers. Among the treasures inside: the only surviving copy of Benjamin Franklin's first Poor Richard's Almanack, Bram Stoker's notes for Dracula, the manuscript of James Joyce's Ulysses and more than 100 personal letters of George Washington. Nearby, see the country's finest collection of medical artifacts housed at the **Mütter Museum**, featuring over 25,000 medical specimens and instruments displayed in a Victorian "cabinet museum" setting.

FULL DAY

Spend time exploring Philadelphia's Old City and tour the **National Liberty Museum**, which explores themes of diversity and inclusion, civic engagement, and leadership through exhibitions of intricate glass art. Highlights include a replica of Nelson Mandela's jail cell, an exhibit honoring the heroes of 9/11, and a 21-foot-tall glass Flame of Liberty, and a crack-less, ring-able copy of the Liberty Bell. Learn about the history of chemistry at the **Science History Institute**, just next door.

Head to the hip Northern Liberties neighborhood and visit the **Edgar Allan Poe National Historical Site**. The only remaining of Poe's Philadelphia homes, it is here where the iconic author penned some of his most famous tales, including The Black Cat. Make your way further north to the free-to-visit **Wagner Free Institute of Science**, which boasts more than 100,000 natural history specimens including fossils, shells, minerals, mounted animal skeletons and skins displayed in original wood and glass cabinets.

Head down to South Street to bask in the reflections of **Philadelphia's Magic Gardens**. Half indoor, half outdoor, fully out of the ordinary, this mesmerizing labyrinth is the largest work to date by mosaic artist Isaiah Zagar. Head to the Delaware River Waterfront and explore **Cherry Street Pier** - a former municipal pier that is now a mixed-use space with artist studios, rotating exhibitions, and pop-up events.

End the day by visiting historic sites on a candlelit **Ghost Tour of Philadelphia**.
